

**National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Categorical Exclusion (CE) Assignment
Pre-Assignment Readiness Assessment Checklist
(rev. January 22, 2026)**

Background and Purpose

The purpose of this checklist is to serve as a tool for States to assess their readiness to assume NEPA responsibilities under 23 U.S.C. 326. This may help inform actions to take before pursuing NEPA CE Assignment or assuming NEPA CE responsibilities. This checklist is only applicable to Categorical Exclusion (CE) Assignment; there is a separate checklist for Program Assignment (23 U.S.C. 327).

FHWA can help State DOTs with conducting a readiness assessment of their environmental review program, including environmental review resources, processes, and procedures.

This document is intended to be used before a readiness assessment occurs.

Not every question on this checklist needs to be addressed. Rather, this document can be used as a tool to understand broad steps and considerations the State may need to take to prepare to assume NEPA CE responsibilities. Completion of this checklist does not guarantee FHWA approval to implement a NEPA CE assignment program.
